## Who is eligible?

Any student in Greenwich Academy's Middle School for the 2021-2022 school year.

## When?

This reading contest runs from June 7 – September 17, 2021. Cross off your squares as you complete them and turn in your board to Ms. Slattery in the GA Middle School library by September 17. - A particular book can "count" toward only one square. Please don't use the same book for multiple squares, even if the book can fit more than one category.
- Please do *not* use your summer reading assignments from your teachers toward this Bingo board.

## **Prizes?** Of course!

- If you achieve BINGO, you will receive a bookmark bundle and gel pen after September 17. BINGO means completing one of the following: one row of five squares, one column of five squares, or a diagonal line of five squares.
- If you achieve a BLACKOUT BINGO BOARD (every square completed), your name will be entered into a raffle for a \$50 bookstore gift card! This raffle will take place after September 17.

Read a picture book or story out loud to a person or a pet.	Read a book in a genre you wouldn't normally choose.	Read a book about a character who does not look like you or live like you.	Reread a childhood favorite.	Read a book you already own but have never read.
Read a book with a one-word title.	Read a book published in 2021.	Create a new cover for a book. Bring it in in September or send a picture of it to: library@greenwich academy.org	Read a book with non-human characters.	Read in a blanket fort for 45 minutes.
Read a book that involves science.	Read a book that has been made into a movie. Optional: Watch the movie!	Read a book with a number in the title.	Listen to an audiobook.	Read a mystery.
